

Tips for being greener tourists: respecting and helping

1. LOOK FOR OPTIONS

Always carry a refillable water bottle and reusable bags with you. Reject the plastic whenever you can. We remind you that Ushuaia has municipal policies on single-use plastic banning plastic bags, sale of plastic swabs and consumption of single-use plastics inside dining places.



4. ALWAYS MINIMIZE WASTE MANAGEMENT

Do you know the 3R rule? Reduce, reuse and recycle. The best waste is that which is not generated. Avoid generating waste whenever you can.



5. BRING YOUR WASTE BACK

When you go on an excursion, always bring your waste. Even cigarette butts. Nature is never their place. When it comes to navigating the Beagle Channel, don't throw anything into the water. No food either. This can disrupt the ecosystem.



6. TAKE CARE OF NATURE

Respect our flora and fauna. When it comes to excursions, don't leave the trails, don't step on the peat or pluck wild flowers or plants. Don't take stones or leaves from trees as souvenirs. Nature must remain intact after your visit.



7. CONSUME LOCAL

Always try to choose local and artisan products. In this way you favor the economy and expression of the local culture. Learn about history, culture and gastronomy.
